BOARD NOMINATIONS

EXPLANATORY DOCUMENT

Hutchesons' Educational Trust is the legally constituted entity which administers Hutchesons' Grammar School. The Trust is a registered charity, regulated by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR).

The Board of Governors of Hutchesons' Educational Trust is made up of 11 nominated and 9 co-opted Governors. Each Governor is expected to serve an initial term of office of 4 years, and may if re-nominated or re-co-opted serve a further 4 year term.

There are nine nominating bodies in the Trust's Constitution:

- Church of Scotland Presbytery of Glasgow;
- University of Glasgow;
- University of Strathclyde;
- Merchants House of Glasgow;
- Trades House of Glasgow;
- Hutchesons' Hospital;
- Glasgow Educational and Marshall Trust;
- Hutchesons' Grammar School Association; and
- Hutchesons' Former Pupils' Club.

Through nominations and co-options, the Board of Governors try to ensure that as many disciplines as possible are represented on the Board, namely:

- Legal
- Finance
- Academic
- Property Development;
- Personnel / Pastoral;
- Marketing
- Property Maintenance;
- Fund Raising;
- Medical; and
- ICT.

The Board is a dual gender board, and nominations and co-options of either gender are equally welcome.
