20 years ago, L'Oréal and UNESCO founded the For Women in Science programme to promote and highlight the critical importance of ensuring greater participation of women in science. Each year, the international programme rewards female scientists at critical stages of their career and helps advance their research.

L'Oréal-UNESCO For Women In Science UK & Ireland Fellowship Programme

Since 2007, L'Oréal UK and Ireland and the UK National Commission for UNESCO have annually awarded five Fellowships to early career researchers. The fellowships have been designed to provide flexible and practical financial support to ensure these women further their research and careers. With the flexible grant, winners may choose to spend their fellowship on buying scientific equipment, paying for childcare, travel costs or indeed whatever they need to continue their research. In addition to financial support, each year past and present fellows receive training and networking opportunities supported by L'Oréal.
