Who was John Mather?

John Mather was a West of Scotland based apprentice who became a lover of the arts, a business visionary and a lifelong employee of what became Clydeport (an organisation in which he had a hugely significant role).

John joined the Clyde Navigation Trust at age 16 and was appointed personal assistant to the general manager, and a few years later he became the administration manager. Within ten years he had risen to the post of managing director before becoming chairman and later executive chairman before the company was privatised and floated on the London Stock Exchange in 1994.

Education and opening the pathway to career opportunity were both very important to John and those themes form threads running through the charitable purposes of the grant-giving charitable trust he established.

Before John's untimely death in 2001, he had already set up a fund to assist young people in the West of Scotland obtain a foot on the career ladder; from craft apprentices at a range of colleges to those with the ambition and talent to become technicians, engineers, business people, scientists, musicians and artists. The John Mather Trust was set up on 20 October 1995. A significant portion of John's personal estate passed to the charity on his death.

Having come from relatively humble beginnings, John believed passionately that lack of funds should not stop young people from being able to further their chosen careers. With this in mind, the trustees recognise that the John Mather Trust was set up to provide little things that can make a big difference to people, not grandstanding donations, but to give amounts that will have impact.

The John Mather Trust's Charitable Purposes

The trustees welcome applications which meet the core objectives and purposes of the trust. The Trust's purposes (as set out in the trust deed) are:-

"the purposes of the Trust are the relief of poverty; the advancement of education of the public; the promotion of the arts and architecture in general and in particular in Glasgow and the hinterland of the River Clyde ("the Area") and to further the purposes of charitable organisations or to promote other purposes which are charitable in law within or without the Area as the Trustees in their absolute discretion think fit and in furtherance thereof but not otherwise:-

- (1) to encourage the charitable activities of organisations supporting the above purposes in order to benefit the sick and those in necessitous circumstances in the Area;
- (2) to promote and improve the education of those attending schools, colleges, universities and like establishments in the Area;
- (3) to award scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries or maintenance allowances tenable at any school, college, university or other educational establishment approved by the Trustees;
- (4) to provide financial assistance, tools, instruments or books to persons in necessitous circumstances on leaving educational establishments to prepare them for, or assist their entry into, a trade, profession or service;

- (5) to promote the education and training of persons who through social or economic circumstances are in need thereof and are unable to gain employment and to promote schemes whereby such persons may receive training while unemployed or in employment; and
- (6) to promote, improve, develop and maintain public education about and appreciation of the business world in all its aspects by the presentation of lectures and in such other ways as the Trustees may determine from time to time."

Parameters for grant funding

The charity was established to provide a lasting legacy by enshrining John Mather's historic charitable giving to a range of charities and individuals and accordingly the trustees will identify recipients and projects who they believe will advance the charitable purposes through the making of grants (ordinarily through organisations) to create opportunities for young people in the areas of the arts and culture, entrepreneurialism and employability skills for those from or based in Glasgow, the west of Scotland and in more special circumstances Scotland.

Typically, the trustees make grants or donations of up to £10,000 to a number of organisations each year. Larger amounts may be available in exceptional circumstances.

The John Mather Trust has established and developed a "Rising Star" funding programme which provides grants mainly through educational and arts and culture organisation nominations to help young people realise their potential to achieve their career aspirations across a range of sectors. Nominations will be accepted from primary schools, secondary schools, colleges and universities; however Rising Star applications are also welcomed from youth groups and other charitable organisations.

Applications are invited from any organisations or groups (educational, arts and culture or otherwise) with similar charitable purposes and who can identify suitable candidates for grants, however the trustees are particularly interested in supporting organisations and individuals based, from or operating in Glasgow, the west of Scotland and in more special circumstances, Scotland.
