- Do autistic academics disclose their autism at work and what reasons lead to this choice?



WHO CAN TAKE PART?

- **identify as autistic** (can have a formal diagnosis but not required).
- currently or recently working in
 a physics academic position
 (e.g. PhD / postdoc / lecturer / professor).
- academic position is/was **UK-based**.



WHAT'S INVOLVED?

- 1 hour introduction
 session including a short online questionnaire
- 1 hour interview about your experiences
- Sessions are planned to be held via video call (Zoom), with some alternative options available.
